
Grave Creek Hills Elevation: 1,900' - 2,749'

The Grave Creek Hills main view point is approximately 11 vehicle miles and 40 minutes from the Hugo I-5 interchange (Map 1).

The Hills' elevation ranges from 1,900' to 2,749' with several viewpoints both into Hugo and Sunny Valley.

- 0.0 Hugo I-5 Interchange Parking. Elev. 1,160'
- 5.2 Sunny Valley I-5 Interchange
- 5.4 Stop Sign
- 5.5 Mobil Sign
- 5.6 Old Stage Road (Pacific Highway from 1913 -1920) & Sunny Glen Way Junction
- 6.6 BLM Copper Queen Road No. 34-6-11.1
- 6.8 Rat Creek
- 7.0 BLM Road No. 34-6-15
- 8.0 Copper Queen Mine Tailings
- 9.1 "Y' in Road and start of mostly dirt logging rd.
- 9.3 Start 4-wheel drive
- 11.0 Enter First Clear Cut on Ridge of Grave Creek Hills (views start)
- 11.4 Minor Saddle in Range at View Point

The drive from the Hugo I-5 interchange to the Grave Creek Hills view points is on pavement and gravel roads (two-wheel drive to four-wheel drive).
